Dear Friends in Christ,
The following are random thoughts from a woodpile meditation during a recent pastor's retreat and a prayer exercise called 'spiritualizing the creation.'

The woodpile—stacked neatly like we imagine our lives need to be. In reality, to be used or of service, the wood is scattered, broken, burned, consumed, sawn, split, nailed, and stained or painted. Sawdust, ashes, chunks of bark and splinters leave a mess behind—like our lives lived—it gets messy, it's painful, we have to change and sacrifice, die to self.

As we sit, all piled up and ready, we may lament, "No one has chosen to use us yet." But what of the shelter we give to spiders, mice, snakes, gophers? What of the satisfaction and assurance of preparedness, of future warmth, or structure I will provide? What if the purpose changes? I might become a footrest, a candle holder, a door stop. Is willingness to serve, however called, the key?

No matter our size, we're essential to a good fire. We may be tinder, kindling, or fuel. We may burn slowly, quickly, hotly, or just smolder. Does not the Spirit burn as She wills? A spark here, a raging furnace there. How might we be a pleasing scent rising up as smoke to God as we are consumed?

There is a sense of commonality, stacked together for a purpose. There is an awareness that others will have to join us eventually because we will be burnt up, pass on to ashes, become one with the earth again, and provide nourishment for new growth.

We will warm folks inside and out. We may stubbornly refuse to burn. We may rot—even then, we can serve as compost.

On the surface we are sharp, rough, broken, solid. We have layers, curves, knots. We can be rearranged to better fit. (serve)

We come from something much larger than ourselves. The cracks and scars and splinters tell of our history. God can/will use us no matter our life stage, our size, our looks, our pre-conceived notion of worthiness, where we come from, whether we are aware of self potential or not, whether others see purpose in us or not.

There is a sense of balance, precariousness, yet potential for rebuilding if toppled. We can always make room for more, one more.

There is an untapped energy within us. There is a piece of eternity, too. And the peace of eternity. Because God created and it is good.

I am grateful for eyes and mind and heart to see; for willingness to receive revelation; for the special closeness I'm allowed to feel.
