Motion to approve David and Roberta Baker be on the Voluntary Action Council account at the West Liberty State Bank and they will be the First Church United coordinators for the West Liberty Food Pantry as of May 1, 2017 1st Bill Koellner, 2nd Joel Murphy, unanimously approved by the Board.

Deepak G will arrange for that to be done. The speakers currently used are property of CYG and are moved periodically so we cannot mount or move them. Brenda will talk to West Music about speakers and options.
8. Fellowship Hall bathroom - people locked in bathroom, replace door lock. Bill K. will check with Dillon Brooke about fixing that. Deepak G. will help if Dillon cannot.
9. Computer/Printer/Router issues over the last couple weeks were fixed by Richard Hart.

Outside the Church

1. NE wall of new wing has water mark (possible roof work needed) - Jim K. will look into it.
2. Hole in caulking in E. stain glass window (on outside) - Jim K. will look into it.
3. Landscaping plan - front of church, plants for church sign, bell tower planters flower pots around outside church, new trees, more (funding Memorial committee) - Marilyn Ruegsegger, Bill & Jan Koellner. Bill K reports the Memorial Committee would like to help with purchasing trees.
