FOOD PANTRY January Report

I am pleased to report that we had another record breaking month at the food pantry. In November we added a sheet that told the food pantry hours and days open to the applications for a Christmas box. I have always been concerned that we have between 95 and 110 families apply for a Christmas box. I understand that there are 79 Children involved in the back pack program and we were only seeing 20-25 families at The food pantry. This month we saw a total of 37 families representing 106 people visit the food pantry and get food help. We continue to need all food items and any donations large or small are greatly appreciated.

January saw the first time members of the other churches in town were scheduled to help man the food pantry. This sharing of the workload has a two prong benefit. David and Bertie Baker do not have to be at the food pantry every hour it is open. We also hope the volunteers will return to their respective church and share what they have observed like the number of families that visit and the amount of food that goes out the door. Encouraging their member to remember the food pantry when they are looking for a place to volunteer or a place to donate nonperishable food products or money too. Bertie and David both enjoyed meeting the other volunteers and working with them.

We have had some volunteers go to Davenport to the River Bend Food Bank and pick up or food order and bring it to First Church United. This is a lot of work. You handle the order to take it off the pallet on the loading dock, put it in the vehicle, then drive to West Liberty and unload it First Church United. There is a large area where donations are received at the Food Bank and we are allowed to check out the donations and take what we think we can use. Many perishables are available, and we sort through the fresh fruits and vegetables available which are Free, and that is a price I am willing to pay! We also sort through the baked goods because they are free also. There are boxes of donated food and scratch and dent cases which we can purchase for 18 cents a pound. I try to fill my car to the brim when I go there.

I have sent out a revised schedule of churches that are scheduled to work at the food pantry and I have assigned someone from each church to be in charge of seeing this information in the bulletins, the newsletters, and creating signup sheets. I will try to send an email to remind members of each church they are scheduled to help out one month in advance. I dropped the ball this month and did not give the church scheduled for February notice in January.

Future maintenance of the church was not paid. Keith showed that the Budget of expenses for 2017 was \$106,554.37 and the YTD expenses for 2017 totaled \$107,140.83.

2018 Budget

Keith B. reported on the changes made and agreed upon by the Board. The Pastor's salary has increased 4% and the church will pay Pastor Marian's health insurance of \$3288/year. The CE Director, Secretary and Choir director budget lines have also increased to reflect hourly wage increases and the added position of Children's Bell Choir Director. This is a total of 3.44% increase for the 2018 budget year.

Board discussed going to other churches to see their Sanctuary's and how they are set up. Agreed it would be a good idea to talk to other churches who have gone through Sanctuary remodels.
3. Window in south classroom – Jim K. reported that he and Ken Wright have a plan to look at the window in the next few days to fix it.

Outside the Church

1. NE wall of new wing has water mark - Jim K. reports that Ruesch looked at it last year but waiting for it to rain again. This will have to wait for the spring/summer.
2. Door near sanctuary entrance, sidewalk cracks, and spalled concrete in handicap area - not yet done but will be looked at after Maxson Ave. project is complete.
3. Volunteer Trees in east lawn removed - Joe Myers will take care of this in the spring
4. Door overhangs on NE wing near kitchen to prevent rain entering - Joe M. will talk to Mark Johnson.
5. The light in the parking lot is out. Jim K. will call Kessler to fix it.
6. The tulip tree and others need trimming.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Community Garden – Pastor Marian reports that Ed Moreno has applied for a grant to include 5 fruit trees and a pop-up greenhouse. He needs Board approval to plant these trees. Motion to approve Ed Moreno's recommendations 1st Syd H., 2nd Joel M., unanimously approved by the Board.
2. Necrology report – Marilyn Irely Dec. 10, 2017
3. Manse Dishwasher, disposal and basement ceiling tile – the manse dishwasher is not draining and is rusting, which then breaks off into it. The basement ceiling tile is drooping in the basement due to the water leaking. Board recommends calling Dane Lovell. Pastor Marian will call him. Pastor Marian also wanted the Board to know that Blaine Kelly has ordered a water softener pump and furnace filter for the manse and will install those soon.
4. Move to put in the January minutes the names of the various bank account treasurer's and Amrita Giri is accepted as Congregational Life Committee Treasurer 1st Joel M., 2nd Syd H., unanimously approved by the Board.
