Thank you to the many who gave generously to the West Liberty Ministerial Association Help Fund. A total of \$475.55 was collected!

A funny thing happened on the way home that night. As I was walking across the parking lot, I noticed a couple people hanging out by our dumpster. I greeted them and they started following me. A voice called out, "Hi, excuse me." My awful Spanish skills picked up enough to know they needed help with rent. So I went in the house and got our Help Fund check book, then we paraded back over to the church to fill out the paperwork. I was thinking to myself, "Maybe the offering tonight will be exactly this amount."

Monday morning comes and a young woman is peeking in my window. I motion her to come in. She has a sick child in their pajamas with her. They need help with their electric bill so they don't get shut off. This reminds me I haven't counted the offering yet. And I think, "That would really be great if we got enough to cover both of these needs!" I counted and found the total was even more!

A half hour later I received a phone call asking for \$50 to help with a light bill, again to prevent shut off. The young man came in and also needed food. He hugged me so hard I thought I might need to straighten my glasses afterward. He called me a life-saver!

I wonder who will be blessed with the next \$25.55, perhaps before this day is over. I mean other than me. In the face of all that is wrong in the world, it feels so good to know that we are doing something right here. We pour out our praise to God, we pour out our pocket change or our sacrificial gift in the offering plate, and we pour out hope and love to those who need it most. Thanks be to God.

Food Pantry report for the month of November 2018

We had the pleasure of working with a number of volunteers from the Our Redeemer Lutheran Church this month. We served 46 families representing 150 people. Some families visited more than once this month the total number of families visiting the food pantry was 64 (about a third of the families visited more than once) and with the extra visits the number of people served was 203. (Again about a third of the number of people served visited more than once.) We had a few new families again this month.

Atalissa Christian Church, West Liberty Methodist Church, and others provided 88 pounds of cleaning supplies. From all the sources of gifts to the food pantry we received 1197 pounds. All these donations were not enough to keep the shelves full. On October 4 Ron Jensen and Mike Duytschaver went to the food pantry and picked up 887 pounds of food and again

on October 31 Ron Jensen and Dave Baker went to the food pantry and picked up 1,260 pounds of food.

We received a few donations of cash this month. We thank all the donors for their support, without them we would not be able to visit the Riverbend Food Bank and get large orders of food at deep discounts over other sources available to us.

Volunteer gave the food pantry 56 hours. Considering that we were only open 1 hour on 8 days this month this shows it takes about 7 volunteer hours for every hour the food pantry is open.

On Wednesday, October 31 there was another very generous 529 pound donation from “Becky” in Cedar Rapids. We give thanks for her generosity. We look forward to having help from First Church United in November and West Liberty Christian Church is scheduled to help in December.

January – I have grouped Cedar Valley Methodist, Louise Newcomb is in charge and Atalissa Christian Churches, Sheryl Brown is in charge, together since they are both small churches and do not have a large number of volunteers. Louise and Sheryl should be able to split it any way that suites you, just let me know who will be there on what days.

February- West Liberty Methodist Church, Cindi Sanders is in charge.

October 4, 2018 6:30 p.m.

CALL TO ORDER by Board Chair, Deepak Giri. Those present were Joe Myers, Jim Kiwala, Joel Murphy, Pastor Marian, Keith Barnhart, Syd Harned, Katie Thrasher.

DEVOTION TIME Pastor Marian reflected on stewardship. Time, talent and treasure. How can we do all three? What do we give God?

OPEN IN PRAYER

APPROVAL OF DOCKET add that the church received Marilyn Ireys trust check of \$10,000. Katie Thrasher will write a letter of thanks to the Ireys family. Motion to put the money into General Savings 1st Jim K, 2nd Joe M., unanimously approved by the Board. Move to approve the docket 1st Joe M., 2nd Jim K., unanimously approved by the Board.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES add Joel Murphy to the names present at the September meeting. Change that Jason will preach October 14 and November 11 in the Pastor’s report. Move to approve as amended 1st Joel M., 2nd Jim K., unanimously approved by the Board.

TREASURER’S REPORT

Keith Barnhart reported that we have \$800 in the checking account. \$15,000 has been borrowed from savings. All bills have been paid. All VBS bills have been paid. Receipts were received to cover expenses.

Organ tuner was paid to service the organ following the carpet installation.

Keith will change line 403 to read Insurance not SECA Allowance.

Pastor Marian noticed she used more than budgeted for Continuing Ed. There has not been much used out of Books or Professional Meetings, so Keith will move where those expenses were taken from.

ONGOING BUSINESS:

Inside the Church

1. Immersion Baptismal tub leak- Deepak G. volunteers to look at it at no cost to the church.
2. Vacuum cleaner- Board moves to give Brenda M. the authority to get an appropriate vacuum for the church.
3. FCU Website updates – Joel M. talked to Ethan Anderson about how to reinvest in our church website. Joel learned that we need to maintain and update the website to keep up with current technology. The website would have more resources. They would take pictures that would be on the website.

The proposal from Big Imprint is \$2000 and \$39/month to maintain. Syd H. asks where the money could come from. Pastor Marian explained that the Eastern Iowa Presbytery is offering \$500 grants to digitize archives we could put towards the cost.

Syd H. asked what the Board Discretionary Funds are to be used for. Pastor Marian proposed that the missions be paid if at the 1st of the year we still have the Board Discretionary funds. Currently Board discretionary funds total \$16,304.96.

Move to move forward with the website updating project with the \$2,000 proposal from Ethan Anderson and Big Imprint 1st Syd H., 2nd Jim K., unanimously approved by the Board.

Outside the Church

1. Door near sanctuary entrance, sidewalk cracks, and spalled concrete in handicap area. Jim K. has estimated proposal from All American Concrete for \$10,000-\$12,000. Collins Concrete gave a proposal for \$3,833 in

2017. Both for door area near Sanctuary entrance. Joe M. suggests we use principal from the Watters fund since that is used for Maintenance of the church or to pay debt.
2. Board will identify maintenance needs around the church, grounds, and manse. Syd H. suggests we then present the needs to the congregation after church for a few Sunday's. Jim K. suggests we do a couple of needs a year. There will be a clipboard in the office for potential maintenance needs for Board members to add to beginning Oct. 7th.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Missy Johnson proposes a church address book be published – Joel M. will talk to Missy.
2. Update on Wintering Fair stand – Jim K. and Syd H. report that there was a leak above the fryer. Jim K. caulked the leak, but we have to wait to see if it holds. Jim took down the FCU Fair stand sign from the top of the stand and will put it in the shed. Letha and Vince Ottaway planted Hosta's around the Fair stand. The water will be shut off October 15 and Bob Dewar will bring the water heater to the church for storage and bleed the lines to prevent the pipes from freezing.
3. Discuss process for year-end performance reviews and salary/benefits- Joe M. asks that this year we have closed meetings when discussing performance reviews and salary/benefits. The PRC & Personnel committees would present to the Board, then the Board would meet separately. Syd H. will ask PRC and Personnel committees to have evaluations to Deepak and the Board October 28 and one person from each committee present at the November 1 Board meeting.
4. Dream Catchers would like to use the kitchen to prepare the food for their annual Taco dinner fundraiser. Move to approve 1st Joe M., 2nd Jim K., unanimously approved by the Board.
5. Pastor Marian asks the Board use \$1000 for each Christian Conference Center, Camp Wyoming and the Ministerial Help fund from the Endowment Interest fund. Syd H. moves we take \$3000 from Endowment Interest fund #2108 1st Syd H., 2nd Joe M., unanimously approved by the Board.
