## THOUGHTS ON Why Does a Church Need a Budget?

Churches, like families, require budgets to outline how they receive and allocate funds. Church budgets serve as a guiding blueprint for leaders to follow and implement. Adhering to a budget also fosters accountability within the congregation and enables churches to fulfill their mission of expanding their reach and sharing God's message.

When crafting an annual church budget, it's essential to consider income streams, ongoing expenses, and planned savings/future needs. First Church United's income stream is almost exclusively donations from the congregation. Occasionally we are blessed with an estate bequest. Understanding the operation of the church relies almost exclusively on donations is the reason we are transparent about the giving numbers in our weekly news. Ongoing expenses at First Church United include things like staff expenses (pastor, admin, janitor, CE, choir directors and organists), operational expenses (paper/printing, kitchen items, utilities, insurance), facility and equipment repairs (furnaces, snow removal, roof repairs, lawncare), reserve funds (for unforeseen/emergency items, and future/planned needs), and denomination.

The information above serves to explain how important pledging, during stewardship, can be to the budget & planning process. The 2024 budget has been \$154,087. When divided by 12, this means we need to take in \$12,840 each month to be able to fulfill our budgeted choices. 'Pledges' (turned in during the 2023 stewardship campaign) came to \$87,950, which means we have known throughout 2024 that by unplanned gifts, the grace of God, and outreach and communication, First Church United would be provided with the extra \$66,000 to help us attain the budget goal. The total amount on pledge sheets turned in will inform the 2025 budget planning process.

#### The Truth: Ministry Costs Money

Effective ministry requires financial resources, and the church budget is the framework that supports this. By aligning our budget with our vision and mission, we plan for First Church United to thrive, even in challenging times. Remember, budgeting is not just a financial exercise; it's an expression of this church's commitment to stewardship and the growth of God's kingdom.
